

EVENTS FOR JANUARY

The annual sober-up dive will be held at 10:00 AM on New Year's Day at Pleasure Bay, South Boston. With all the recent warm weather, the water should be warm, so let's try for a good turnout.

The annual children's Christmas party was held on December 16. Tom Schoener played Santa, and the children all had a really good time. There was plenty of food, so the adults had a good time too.


There were no new membership votes during the entire month of December. Are we loosing our popularity? Should we be using Lifebuoy?



*CPR COURSE



CLUB DIVES FOR JUNE




CLUB DIVES FOR AUGUST

DIVES FOR SEPTEMBER






GLUA-DIVES


