Dear Mr. Graver:

We are writing to express our opinion of your plans to institute a diver recertification program. We understand that the plans are to require all divers to be recertified every three years. Our club has been active continuously for 33 years, and our current membership is 137. We are an organization of active divers, many of whom have been diving continuously for more than ten years, and we feel that we are the group who would be most affected by your program. We understand that you are considering changing the name of the program from "recertification" to something more palatable, but we do not believe that you plan to change the content of the program.

There is no evidence that a recertification program would be of any help in preventing accidents. Diving safety experts tell us that most diving accidents take place during a diver's first six dives, and that after that the rate of accidents is sharply reduced. Occasionally a diver who has been inactive for an extended period of time will dive again and get into trouble, but it is extremely doubtful that a recertification course would convince such a diver that his abilities have decreased or that his physical condition has deteriorated in the interval. It is also very doubtful that lack of certification would stop such a diver in the first place. We understand that you are worried about divers who become certified, remain inactive for a period of time, and then go to a tropical resort and dive without having had adequate experience. Conscientious dive masters at resorts check out all divers, and it would be foolish for them not to do so when they are responsible for the divers' safety. We are much more worried about the reverse problem. Many divers become certified at warm water resorts and then come back home and dive in cold water without any training in cold water conditions or in the use of cold water equipment. A recertification program would do nothing to alleviate this serious danger.

If you wish to increase diver safety, the way to do it is to increase the length of the present course and to increase the number of open-water dives required for the completion of the course. The open water dives are of primary importance, and five is not adequate. We are aware that this would be very difficult for the instructors, but it is certainly the best way to decrease the number of accidents. A recertification program would be relatively easy for the instructors and would make money for them, but it would be both expensive and inconvenient for present active divers, those who do not need any additional training.

Present divers were told that their certification was for life, and if they are required to take additional training, it is possible that some legal action can be taken. The Bay State Council of Divers has already shown itself capable of fighting cases in court and lobbying for legislation favorable to divers. Our club would certainly boycott any dive shop or resort which assisted you in promoting a recertification program, and we are sure that we could get the cooperation of all the other clubs in the area.

We understand that NAUI and its instructors are worried about inadequate diver training and about being sued in the case of a diving accident. A recertification program would, however, do nothing to alleviate these problems; it would merely be an inconvenience and hardship for present active divers. We are completely opposed to any mandatory recertification program, and we shall take any action we can to prevent you from initiating one.


