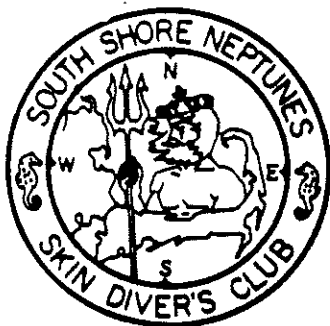

FIX: 1. The estimated position of the boat. 2. The True position of the boat and its crew are in most of the time.


Gong Buoy: One of a class of sound-emitting buoys with movable hammers that hit bells or gongs when waves rock them. Buoys not equipped with active means of sound generation also send characteristic sounds when struck. The nun and the can emit a sharp clunk or clank; The day beacon on pilings yields a deep thudding sound with some splintering noises; fixed channel markers surrounded by rip-rap (circle of stones) give off a grating crackling or crunching sound; channel marking stakes produce a light snap and moorings usually make a series of faint tapping noises as they pass along the hull.

Large, slow circles with light.

When buddy is near, use regular hand signals in front of light.



Something is wrong.

Large, rapid up-and-down motions with arm extended.

UNDERWATER TACTUAL SIGNALS

- 1 Pull — Stop
- 2 Pulls — Go, OK
- 4 Pulls — Surface
- 5 or more — Come here quickly

These simple signals are easily remembered and can be transmitted by a hand squeeze instead of a buddy line. The lack of a three-pull signal allows rapid discrimination between routine "stop" and "go" signals and the more urgent "surface" and "come here quickly" signals.

PAST EVENTS:

June 26th: *Night Dive at Ocean Bluff*, Marshfield. Since this was low tide (20 ft.), the 15 divers enjoyed 1-1/2 hours of watching lobsters, squid and many other nocturnal species. The divers reported good vis (20 ft.) and a very relaxed dive.

July 3rd and 4th *Provincetown Drift Dive*: As the story goes, the Ruff C's had a few problems and got off to a slow start. Once the 1-1/2 hour trip finally began, you would think a few waves and a scramble for gas were enough to endure. during red tide?" Vin said the mussel, which is the part most people eat, is not affected by red tide, but the stomach which some people do eat (not me) is affected similar to a clam and should not be eaten.

8. Should any diver(s) or person(s) be included as subjects in the entry to be considered, their name(s) must be supplied where designated on the registration form. The contestant will indemnify and hold the South Shore Neptunes Skindivers' Club, Inc. and all of its assigns harmless for and against all claims arising from the use of any and all entries submitted.
9. The print judged as the winning print will become the property of the South Shore Neptunes Skindiver's Club, Inc. and will not be returned.
10. Non-winning photographs shall be returned upon written request otherwise, they will be stored in a designated club photo album with their photographic specifications as written on the accompanying registration form.

12. To complete question number eight on the official registration form, please refer to these definitions of photo classifications:
